

## Habakkuk 2:1-3

**Objective: to wait on God is serving Him**

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### Read v.1

1. If you could be a waiter anywhere in the world where would you serve? Why?
  2. What does someone with a firm foundation look like?
  3. How are we mediators like the prophets of the OT used to be?
  4. How do we listen for God's answer? Do we just sit still all the time and do nothing?
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### Read v.2

1. Habakkuk stopped to listen and write down the revelation. What is God saying to you?
  2. Have you ever taken the time to write down what God is telling you? If so, how has that helped you in your faith journey?
  3. If we are heralds with a message from God, what are we supposed to do with it?
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### Read v.3

1. Is God's timing perfect? If so, then why are we so resistant to waiting for Him?

**2 Peter 3:9** The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.

2. How does that verse explain God's timing
  3. Is there some area of your life where you are struggling to wait on God's timing, frustrated by His answers or confused by apparent injustice?
  4. Now take the next few minutes to have an honest personal conversation with God about your struggles, remember...God has broad shoulders and a loving spirit. He is interested in what you have to say! (Pray silently for a few minutes, then pray together as a group)
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## What I will be talking about
