**One Point: Belonging to Christ should be the lens of my actions.**

1. Which generational style (50's, 60's, 70's, etc) do you identify with most?
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### Read v. 9-11

  2. Why is it so hard to live a life that shows we are saved?
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### Read v. 12-14

1. What does Paul mean, "all things are lawful for me?" How do we see this in our society today?
  2. Have we begun to believe that all things are lawful as modern-day Christians? How?
  3. What are some struggles that quickly become a lifestyle/law?
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### Read v. 15-20

1. Why would Paul address sexual immorality as opposed to any other sin? How does sexual sin affect us so deeply?
  2. Is it possible to glorify God with your reaction to sexual temptation? What does that look like? Where does fleeing from sexual immorality start?
  3. What can you do this week to frame your actions in light of what Christ has done for us?
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### What I will be talking about

The Corinthians were beginning to believe that since they have received grace, all things were lawful for them. Paul addresses unrighteousness in its various forms, specifically sexual immorality, that the church was continuing in by making the point that they should live like they have been washed clean of their sins.
